DRIVING RANGE PROJECT

We are delighted to be upgrading the driving range for you to enjoy. Thank you for your patience during the recent short closure periods which allowed our Agronomy Team to extend the lower tee deck by 4 metres and to re-seed the target greens with paspalum grass. A full aeration was also completed on the range floor, along with work on the bunkers and weeding and tidying of the range perimeter. The benefits of these closures will be seen from September onwards when you will be able to enjoy improved turf conditions to play from and enhanced aesthetics of this key area.

GOLF COURSES

Both the Earth and Fire courses have recovered extremely well after the aeration work carried out in May and early June. Golfers are now enjoying two superbly conditioned courses due to the outstanding work by Stuart Horwood and his team. The final summer aerations will take place from 7th to 13th August on Fire, and 21st to 27th August on Earth. These essential works allow for dead organic matter to be removed from the turf to ensure we can provide you with firm and fast playing surfaces for the golfing season.

FAREWELL LESLEY!

We are sorry to be saying goodbye to our wonderful Membership Services Manager, Lesley Wade who will return home to her native Australia in late June after more than a decade with Jumeirah Golf Estates! 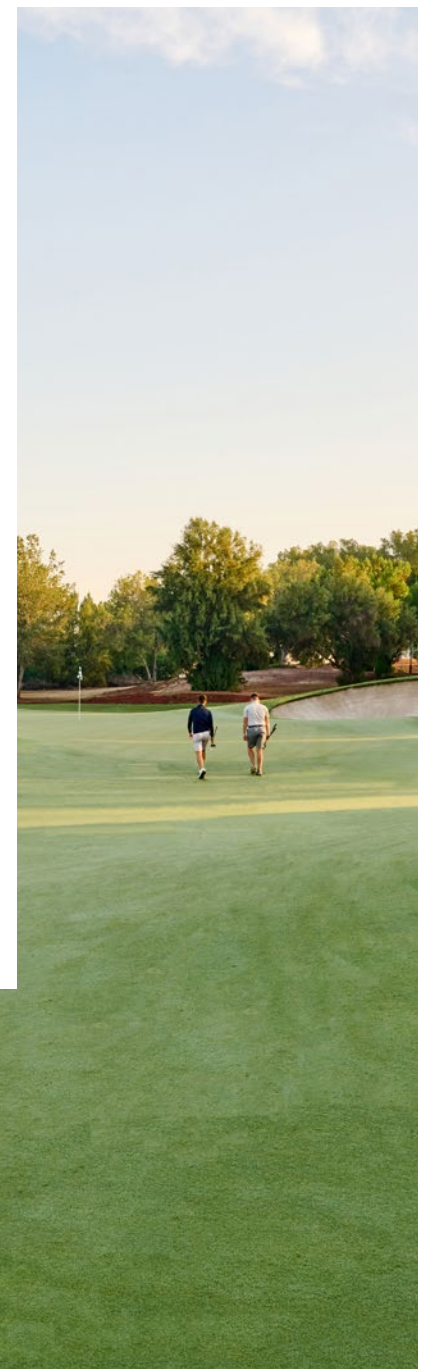
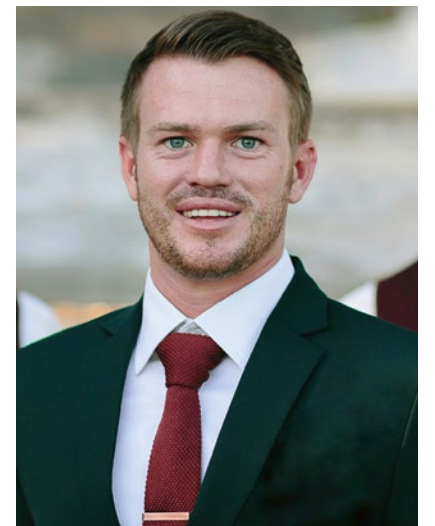

As our buildings at Yas Links and Saadiyat Beach Golf Club continue to age, more and more emphasis is applied to our regular preventative maintenance programmes to ensure we provide safe, healthy and efficient buildings along with facilities for our members and guests to enjoy.



Our Agronomy teams, aptly led by Corey Finn, have already commenced their summer maintenance programmes, with Yas Acres, Saadiyat Beach Golf Club and more recently, Yas Links, undergoing round one of two extensive and rather evasive renovations across all turf areas (tees, greens, fairways and rough).

To the non-golfer, at first view the course can look in a rather alarming condition, especially during the middle of a coring treatment or graden. However, at this time of year with the grass growing at significant rates due to the heat and extended daylight hours, it never ceases to amaze me how quickly the course recovers. In fact, I was only inspecting the course at Saadiyat recently and you wouldn't have thought there had been a significant renovation taken place in recent months, never mind weeks!

As we look ahead, it's certainly an exciting time for Viya Golf and the clubs under our management.

Yas Acres projects includes the delivery of a new food truck to service the pool and Padel courts, as well as the introduction of a new pet friendly garden outlet, to better serve the community of dog owners on Yas Island. We will also be opening a supervised 'Kids Club' for children aged 4 - 14yrs, to enjoy an indoor-outdoor safe, fun and educational environment under the direct supervision of certified child carers.

Members of Yas Acres Golf & Country Club will receive a set number of free passes each month, so they can enjoy using the Club's facilities in the sound knowledge that their children are having fun and being well-looked after.



Yas Links Abu Dhabi projects will first see the opening of 'Crafty Fox' sports bar, serving all of the well known favourites you'd expect of a sport bar. However, our 'gastro tapas' theme will mean that you can try multiple cuisines with a reduced portion size, great for sharing and also indulging on your own. Other projects which are at various stages of concept development include the renovation of our reception area, golf academy building, gym and Hickory's.

Saadiyat Beach Golf Club will soon see the much-awaited floodlighting of the short game area to facilitate evening practice and tuition. The renovation of our on-course food & beverage pavilions, new food & beverage carts, a new Starters Hut to improve your first tee experience, as well as improvements to Hawksbill restaurant, our outdoor Dolphin bar to name but a few.

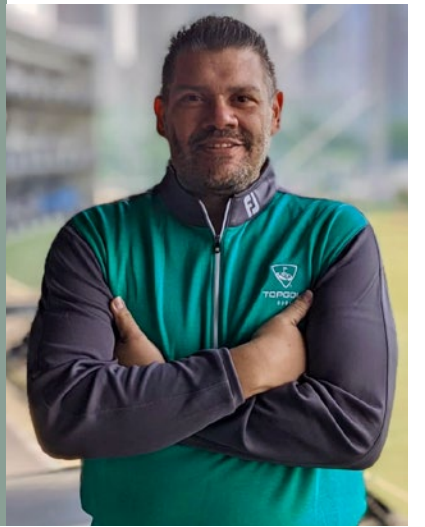

AGRONOMY UPDATE

Well summer for the Golf Course maintenance team means closures and projects. It's never easy during the hotter months and feel it has been considerably hotter than previous so far.

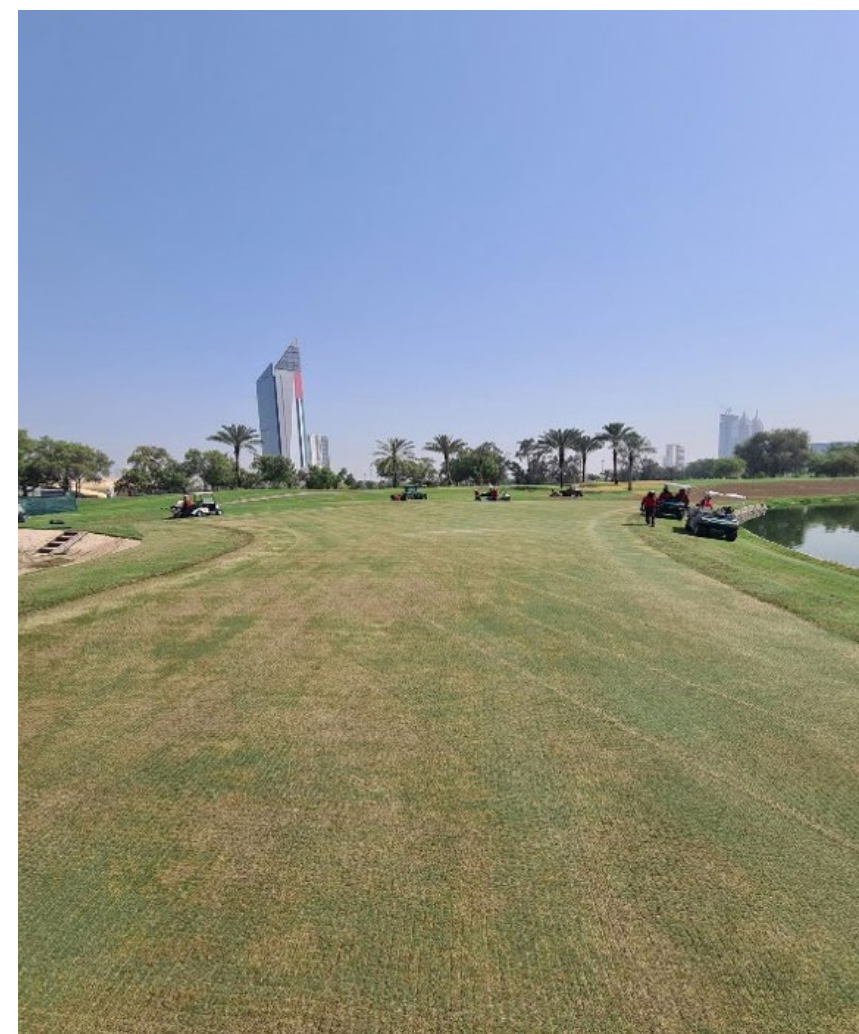
COURSE CLOSURES

We had two course closures so far this summer, on both the Majlis and Faldo. This is when we do our cultural practices like scarifying and heavy topdressing. It was the third time the Majlis greens have had any major work done to them and have responded very well to the work. What we wanted to achieve with the Majlis work was to, again, help the levels of the greens and take out any high areas we might have. This was done by scarifying the greens aggressively. The heavy sand then helped with getting the levels and encourage the grass to grow through.

This year we also used a machine called a Verti Drain. This uses solid tines that go into the surface to a much deeper depth. This was so we could add organic fertilisers to the greens and get them down deeper to help the roots and thus help us have a healthier grass. We scarified

the fairways, tees and approaches this year to help remove organic matter and encourage fresh growth. This was followed by hollow coring to help de-compaction from the cart traffic and give oxygen to the roots. The heavy sand applied then helps the grass to creep and fill in the areas. They have all bounced back well and expect them to be very healthy going forward.

On Faldo Course, we carried out very similar work including scarifying greens, tees, fairways and approaches. All these areas came back quickly and shows what good condition Faldo Course has been in this year. We will continue to do our small maintenance during our Monday closures and feel this is a big factor in why this course has been consistently good.



UPCOMING PROJECTS

As the courses are a lot quieter in the summer it means we can do projects. This year will be no different with a few planned to help improve the course from a condition and aesthetic point of view. I have listed below the major ones we are planning and will slowly work throughout the next 3 months.

- The back bunker on 9/18th green Majlis will be adjusted in size so that the hospitality at the Dubai Desert Classic can move further away from the putting green. This has been an issue for us the last 2 years, with the green suffering and losing grass as it gets zero sunlight and a lot of traffic.
- We plan to enlarge more tees on the Majlis course to spread wear during the golfing season. The ones we have ear marked are 1, 4, 9, 11, and 13. This will happen throughout the summer and been grown in for the season.
- Perimeter tree trimming has started on the Majlis course and will move to the Faldo after. This is done every 2 years. We will look at trees that have got too big also, as they course be causing a block in sunlight or issues with dropping leaves.
- The 7th green approach will be removed and re-shaped as it has become quite uneven over time. The aim will be to smooth this out and have a better run off to the water.
- Will again be working on the driving range outfield to improve the condition. The young grass we put down last year didn't cope well with the wear of the ball picker through the winter. We aim to strengthen this grass with roping areas and re-sprigging. Then give it time to mature and be healthy for the season ahead.

I look forward to seeing you after the summer and when all projects and renovations are complete.

AGRONOMY UPDATE

It's been a great year so far for the Agronomy team at Jumeirah Golf Estates. The investments made over the past year are starting to show, and to the benefit for all our members and guests. Firstly, is the new grass at the Tommy Fleetwood Academy. In the summer of 2022, we fully re-grassed the Academy with Paspalum grass. This has now been fully established and is not only playing well but presenting extremely well. If you haven't been down to have a look, please do so as soon as possible.

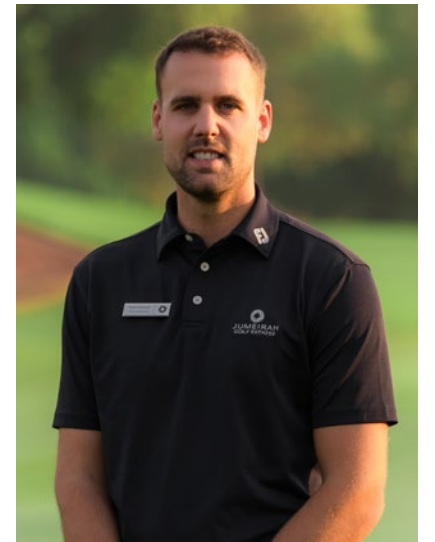


We are already halfway through our summer aeration plans. Both courses have recovered from this and are now playable. Aeration is a normal practice for all golf courses, and although it can be disruptive short term, the more aeration we do, the better the turf conditions in the season and for the long-term health of the asset. We appreciate all the support for these closures which allows us to give you the best possible golf course conditions. Aeration is the removal of dead organic matter that accumulates in the soil profile, replacing this with clean sand and improving oxygen in the root-zone.



Bunkers seem to be the biggest concern this time of year with many comments saying there isn't enough sand. Although in isolated areas this could be true, a lot of the misconception is the compact sand from the amount we have to water in the summer to keep the grass alive. The water here is high in salt so in the morning the moisture is what is making them compact and in the afternoon the dry salt creates a crust.

We continue to do our best year round to improve the conditions in bunkers but most of the work we carry out can be short lived, so it becomes counter productive to our summer project work and aeration tasks if we continue to add more man hours in that area. The good news is, some investment has been made to add sand to all the Earth Course bunkers this season, and the Fire Course bunkers next year. See below a test bunker we have carried out on 11th on Earth, this new sand integration project will be complete in September. The new sand will improve playability and presentation.



The weed management plan continues to be a success. The overall population of weeds is under control which in turn is improving the turf conditions. It proved to be a good decision not to overseed the roughs on both Fire and Earth.

The Tour players had a better challenge, and our members and guests get to enjoy full grass coverage year-round. Below is an example of an area of transition from the over-seeded rye grass back to Bermuda and the same area without the overseed.

The overseed during winter plays an important role in the weed management, it allows us to continue to spray weeds year-round and have stronger Bermuda grass. Moving forward it is unlikely we will overseed roughs again at Jumeirah Golf Estates due to all the benefits we have experienced.

OTHER ONGOING PROJECTS:

- Landscape – lifting canopies, trimming, and cleaning.
- Driving range target greens overseed
- Driving range tee (lower deck) tee extension and levelling

It's an exciting year at Jumeirah Golf Estates, the Agronomy team feel they are in a great spot to really showcase both courses at their best this season.

We are looking forward to the challenges that we will face together and all the hard work that the team has done over the past 12-18 months coming into the limelight. A special thanks to all the Agronomy team that sacrifice daily to work towards the goal of improving the playing conditions for our members and guests.

all our competitions! However, it was a unique event to close the tour, and was then celebrated over closing drinks hosted by Andrew at the R&A! Overall, it was a very special tour, with a very special group who became, and will always be, good friends. The culture of the tour was reflective of what has been a memorable year as Captain, and I cannot thank all those who joined for delivering such an enjoyable event. I was just sorry that you had no opportunity to use your waterproof kit!

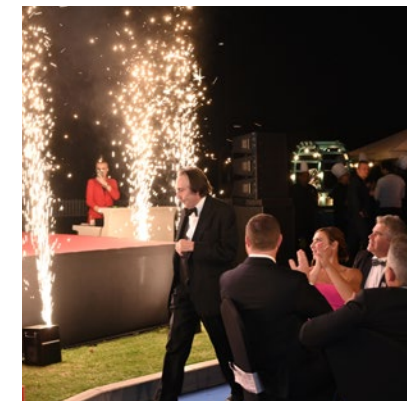

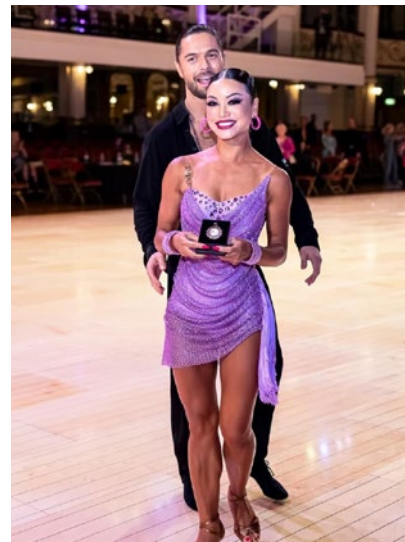
A VIBRANT SEASON OF CAMARADERIE AND COMPETITION FOR THE LADIES OF JUMEIRAH GOLF ESTATES

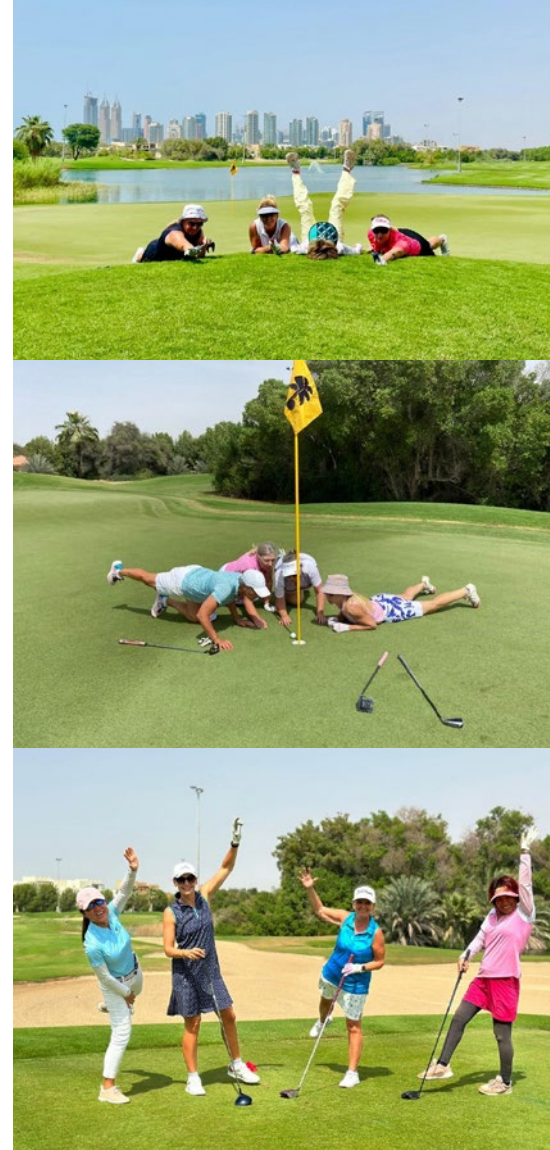

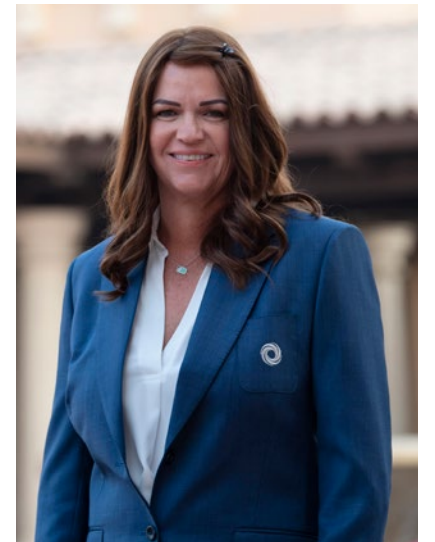


AWAY GOLF DAY AND DINNER: FUN, FRIENDSHIP & FANTASTIC CUISINE

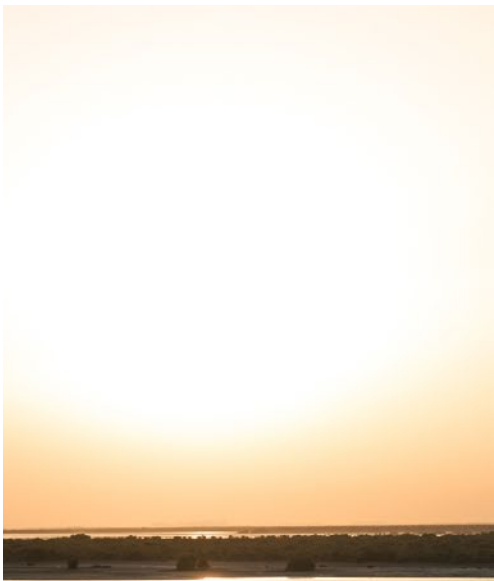
Wow, it is almost the end of June, how did the time fly past this year, especially if you were having fun playing golf on one of the best courses on the planet.

Sekhar Reddy carded a very respectable net 71 on the day to take this month's Division B third place. Scott Harrison of Dubai Creek Golf & Yacht Club finished the day with a net score of 73 and good enough to claim the Division C top spot and medal prize. Max Burrow continued the strong



representation of Dubai Creek Golf & Yacht Club as he won the best gross prize shooting a very impressive 70 gross to win out over the rest by a single stroke. Max played solidly all day, carding three birdies and an eagle on the 13th hole.

Participants played a Medalford Individual Stroke Play format and also recorded Stableford scores. Ladies were playing from the orange tee markers, with gents playing from the OMA Emirates tee markers. The Handicap allowance was 95%.

The Medalford field was split into two divisions, participants with a playing with a 10.4 handicap and below participating in 'Gents Division A' and those with a handicap of 10.5 and below competing in 'Gents Division B'.

A STAR IS BORN

Clark Wins 123rd U.S. Open at LACC

On a championship Sunday that featured a bevy of leading stars, it was an up-and-comer who had an Oscar-worthy performance at The Los Angeles Country Club.

Playing in the shadows of Hollywood, Wyndham Clark, who had missed the cut in his only two previous U.S. Open starts and finished no better than a share of 75th in six major-championship starts, stole the show to claim a one-stroke victory.

Showing the moxie of a steely veteran, Clark, 29, of Denver, Colo., overcame two late bogeys on Nos. 15 and 16 with a brilliant par save on the 71st hole, then two-putted from 60 feet on the 72nd hole to hold off world No. 3 Rory McIlroy. Clark's even-par 70 gave him a four-day total of 10-under 270.

"You know, this is now my second win on the PGA Tour, and the first one [at last month's Wells Fargo Championship] was surreal and this one is surreal," said Clark. "It hasn't quite hit me yet. Walking up 18 was pretty emotional, and then finishing. It's been a whirlwind the last five, six weeks. Just so blessed and humbled to be here."

Rickie Fowler, a five-time PGA Tour winner who had led the championship the first three days and shared the 54-hole lead with Clark, struggled from the outset in his bid for a first major and posted a disappointing 5-over 75 to share fifth with Tommy Fleetwood and Min Woo Lee at 5-under 275.

World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler also was stuck in neutral most of the day and finished with a 70 to finish in solo third, three behind the winner.

When Clark made it official with his tap-in par on 18, he was immediately hugged by older sister, Kristin, and younger brother, Brendan. One person missing from the celebration was his late

mother, Lise Thevenet, whom the family lost to breast cancer in 2013 at age 55.

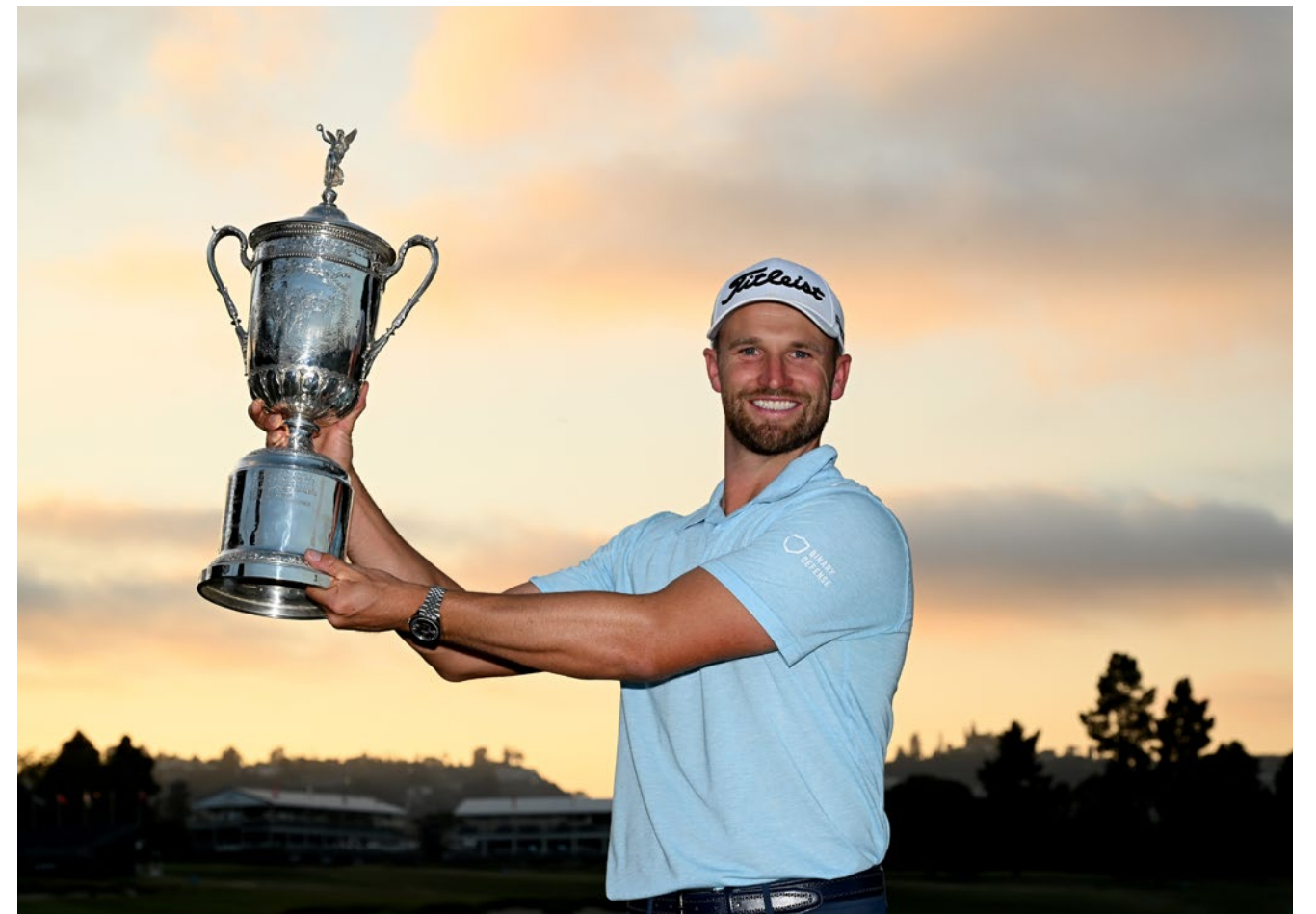
"All I really wish is that my mom could be here, and I could just hug her, and we could celebrate together – but I know she's proud of me," said Clark, who will share his victory later with his father, Randall, a former collegiate and professional tennis player.

When his mother lost her battle with cancer, Clark considered walking away from the game. The loss also factored in his decision to transfer from Oklahoma State to the University of Oregon for the 2016-17 year. He went on to win the Pacific-12 Conference title in Boulder, Colo., near his hometown, and was named Golfweek's player of the year. Clark told reporters this week that his mother's advice to him before every tournament was to "play big."

He heeded that mantra this week, especially on the weekend when he found himself in the final pairing with Fowler each of the last two days. While Sunday's round wasn't perfect, his up-and-downs on Nos. 8, 9, 11 and 17 eventually won him the championship. The bogey on the par-5 eighth when he barely moved the ball on his third shot in thick greenside rough was reminiscent of his bogey save late Saturday on the 17th hole.

Most observers were expecting McIlroy, Fowler or Scheffler – three of the biggest names in golf – to hoist the trophy at day's end. They received the most boisterous roars on Sunday, but all three failed to match the adulation on the 7,359-yard George C. Thomas Jr. design that underwent a restoration by Gil Hanse in preparation for the first U.S. Open in Los Angeles since 1948.

McIlroy, who claimed the last of his four majors at the PGA Championship in 2014, birdied the opening par 5 but didn't make another birdie the rest of the day despite a number of golden



opportunities. He three-putted the par-5 eighth for a par and bogeyed the par-5 14th when his 117-yard approach shot came up short of the green.

This was his second major disappointment in the last year; he came up just short to Cam Smith in the 150th Open Championship at St. Andrews. This week, McIlroy hit 59 of 72 greens in regulation, which ties for the most by any player who did not go on to win the U.S. Open.

"The last real two chances I've had at majors I feel like have been pretty similar performances," said McIlroy, referring to last July on the Old Course. "Not doing a lot wrong, but I didn't make a birdie since the first hole today. Just trying to be a little more, I guess, efficient with my opportunities and my looks."

Fowler was trying to be the feel-good story of the championship. He didn't qualify for the last two U.S. Opens – a year ago at The Country Club he was the odd man out as an alternate – and slipped to as low as No. 185 in the Official World Golf Ranking.

But since returning to instructor Butch Harmon, the 2015 Players champion who finished in the top five of all four majors in 2014, had slowly regained his confidence and form. He even said after Round

3 on Saturday that he wasn't afraid to fail because of what he's endured the past two years. After shattering the 36-hole birdie mark with 18, he could only muster five on the weekend, including two in the final round against seven bogeys.

"I just didn't have it today," said the 34-year-old Fowler, whose engaging personality makes him one of the most-liked players in the game. "Iron play was very below average and didn't make anything. That's a big thing in majors, especially on a Sunday."

Meanwhile, Scheffler just couldn't get hot with his putter. The 2022 Masters champion, who had an eagle-birdie finish on Saturday, carded an even-par 70 with three birdies and three bogeys. That's normally a recipe for success in a U.S. Open, but the 2022 runner-up needed more fireworks to overcome a three-stroke deficit to start the day on a course that yielded 10 rounds of 65 or better this week.

Clark carded a first-round 64 that was only two strokes off the record-setting performances of Fowler and Xander Schauffele. He followed with rounds of 67, 69 and 70 to become the fifth consecutive champion to make the U.S. Open his first major title. To find a longer streak one has to go back 50 years (1973-78).

Now he's a major champion in a town that loves its stars.

GOLF CLUBS IN THE UAE COME TOGETHER TO SUPPORT WOMEN IN GOLF CHARTER

All 22 golf clubs in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) have signed The R&A's Women in Golf Charter to demonstrate their collective commitment to growing golf amongst women and girls in the region.

With the UAE becoming the first ever country to sign all clubs to the charter, representatives from The R&A and signatories gathered to celebrate the occasion at Jumeirah Golf Estates.

The Women in Golf Charter leads The R&A's drive to increase the number of women and girls participating in golf and to encourage more opportunities for women to work within the golf industry. Since being launched in 2018, over 1,300 organisations in 75 countries have signed the Charter, but the UAE is the first country in the world to have all its golf clubs as signatories.

The Women in Golf Charter aims to inspire an industry-wide commitment to developing a more inclusive culture within golf around the world and to enable more women and girls to flourish and maximise their potential at all levels of the sport.

The Women in Golf Charter specifically aims to:

- Strengthen the focus on gender balance and provide a united position for the golf industry.
- Commit national federations and organisations to support measures targeted at increasing participation of women, girls and families in golf.
- Call on signatories to take positive action to support the recruitment, retention and progression of women working at all levels of the sport.
- Set individual targets for national federations for participation and membership and annual reporting of progress.
- Develop an inclusive environment for women and girls within golf.

Adoption of the Charter requires signatories to make meaningful and tangible pledges to build on current initiatives and develop new projects that will focus on encouraging more women and girls to play golf and stay within the sport, while also empowering women to enjoy successful careers working within the golf industry.

Some Charter commitments that have been made by golf clubs in the UAE include:

- Encourage more women and girls' exposure on website and social media channels.
- Providing training and education for staff and stakeholders to promote diversity and inclusion and eliminate barriers or biases that may exist.
- Create a pathway to encourage women to continue to participate in the sport from new women academy members through to membership of the club.
- Establish quarterly reviews between the charter champion and management to evaluate the delivery of existing commitments.

At an event held today at Jumeirah Golf Estates, Jackie Davidson, Director of Golf Development at The R&A and Neal Graham, Development Manager – Middle East and India at The R&A, outlined how the golf industry can work together to achieve these goals at a launch event at Jumeirah Golf Estates, one of the UAE's leading golf facilities and signatory of the Women in Golf Charter.

Davidson said, "The Women in Golf Charter has really galvanised the golf industry around a shared vision for golf and driven change. Since 2018 we have seen over 1,300 organisations in 75 countries, including the United Arab Emirates make their commitment to the Charter and the development of women and girls' golf. We are already seeing the benefits of this in golf participation numbers around the world, a trend that The R&A and all signatories have a responsibility towards continuing."

Graham added, "The United Arab Emirates has a proud history of supporting golf at the very highest levels including hosting professional and elite amateur championships for the world's best golfers. But equally important is providing the opportunity for everyone to experience and enjoy golf."

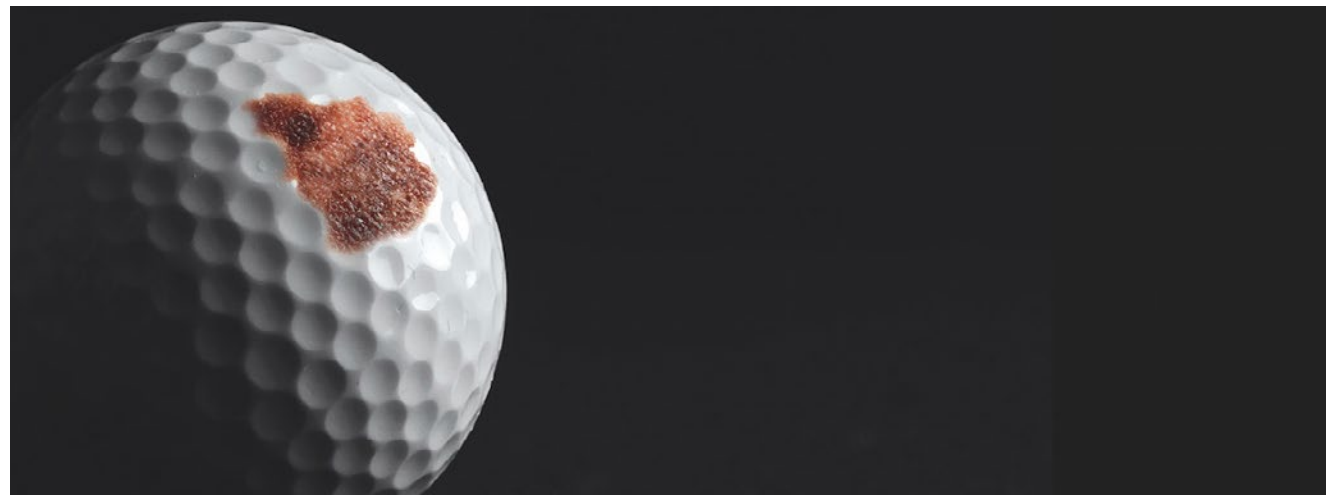
The R&A is delighted that all 22 golf clubs in the United Arab Emirates are signatories of the Women in Golf Charter which will position golf as a welcoming sport for women to engage with and contribute the further success of golf in the country."

The event was attended by representatives of each golf club who will act as charter champions and lead their club's commitment to the Charter. Also in attendance were other organisations who have pledged their support as signatories of the Charter including the Emirates Golf Federation, IMG and the DP World Tour.

General Abdulla Alhashmi, Vice Chairman of the Emirates Golf Federation said, "The Emirates Golf Federation is proud that the UAE is the first country in the world to have all its golf clubs signed up to the Women in Golf Charter. GOLF'S SILENT KILLER

(and how to fight it)

By the time you finish reading this, somebody somewhere will have received the devastating news that they have skin cancer.

Inevitably, the words will hang in the air, suspended in an instant of horrified disbelief as their impact and implications sink in.

Skin cancer has become the most common form of cancer in the UK, with 100,000 new cases diagnosed every year. In the US, that number exceeds four million, with between 40% and 50% of all Americans who live to be 65 expected to develop some form of the disease.

Recent research has identified golfers as one of the groups most 'at risk' of skin cancer and yet so many who play the game remain blissfully ignorant as to either its causes or the likelihood of contracting it.

It is time for that ignorance to end.

Broadly speaking, there are three main different types of skin cancer. The most common (and mildest) of these is Basal Cell Carcinoma. It is a cancer that grows on parts of your skin that are exposed to a lot of sun, particularly your nose and face. They typically start off as small, shiny bumps and have a tendency to grow slowly. They are

also unlikely to spread to other parts of your body. The second most common form of skin cancer is Squamous Cell Carcinoma. Again, it's usually found on areas of the body damaged by UV rays – either from the sun or tanning beds – and is a fairly slow-growing skin cancer. Unlike other forms, it can spread to the tissues, bones and nearby lymph nodes, which makes treatment more difficult. However, caught early enough, it's eminently treatable.

Then there's the third type: melanoma. It is the most dangerous form of skin cancer, which develops when unrepaired damage to skin cells – mostly caused by UV rays – triggers genetic defects that cause the skin cells to multiply rapidly and form malignant tumours. According to Cancer Research UK, there are 15,419 new cases of melanoma skin cancer diagnosed in the UK every year, of which as many as two-thirds are associated with exposure to UV radiation from the sun.

Mortality rates for the disease have more than tripled since the 1970s, with around 2,500 deaths – approximately seven per day – recorded in the UK in 2014. Cancer Research UK estimates that one in 54 people will be diagnosed with malignant melanoma in their lifetime.

Skin cancer is also an extremely indiscriminating disease. Anybody can get it. The risk, though, is thought to be higher amongst people



with: fair skin and/or light-coloured eyes; an abundance of large and irregularly-shaped moles; a family history of skin cancer; and a history of excessive sun exposure or blistering sunburns. Those who have lived at high altitudes or with year-round sunshine and those who have received radiation treatments are also a 'high risk' group.

So, too, are golfers.

According to one study, professional golfers receive an estimated 217 times the amount of UV radiation required to cause sunburn over the course of a year. Likewise, typical club golfers can receive as much as 5.4 times the amount of UV exposure required to cause sunburn for every single hour that they're on the course.

That's relevant because, without taking appropriate preventative measures, such as applying sun cream and so on, a golfer's skin can and will burn when exposed to such high levels of radiation – and, according to a 2014 report published in the US, five serious cases of sunburn can increase the risk of developing skin cancer by up to 80%.

There's also this. Men over the age of 40 have the highest annual exposure to UV radiation, with the majority of people diagnosed with melanoma being white men over the age of 50. Melanoma,

meanwhile, is one of only three cancers with an increasing mortality rate amongst men.

The upside – and there is an upside – is that 99% of all skin cancers are curable. Again, according to Cancer Research UK, Approximately 90% of people who are diagnosed with melanoma skin cancer will live for a further ten or more years. But early detection is critical. Knowing what to look for, where to look for it and then having the good sense and courage to get it checked could, quite literally, be the difference between life and death.

Perhaps unsurprisingly, given the amount of time they spend on the golf course and practice range, many professional golfers have been diagnosed with skin cancer down the years.

Less than two years before he won the Masters, Adam Scott had a Basal Cell Carcinoma removed from his face. The surgery required 30 stitches and has left the Aussie with a scar on his nose. "The procedure made me less lazy with applying sun protection because it was quite painful to have removed," he said.

South African Rory Sabbatini had a Squamous Cell Carcinoma removed from his own face in 2010, whilst PGA champion Jimmy Walker, English pro Brian Davis, Tiger Woods' former coach Hank

Haney and three-time major winner Padraig Harrington have also received skin cancer treatment, Harrington on more than one occasion. Early in 2007, just a matter of months before he won his first major and less than two years after he lost his father to oesophageal cancer, the Irishman had a square-inch of skin removed from his forehead after noticing a spot that wasn't healing. That was the first of four 'things', as he puts it, that he had removed.

"Mine were non-melanoma, fortunately, but of course it's a concern when the doctor first tells you that there's something they need to cut out of you and send away to get checked," Harrington told bunkered. "I tried my best not to worry about it until I got the results. There was nothing I could do at that point so what use was worrying?"

In the end, he got the all-clear but admits that the experiences have changed him. "I'm definitely a lot more diligent about protecting my skin these days," he added. "In fact, if I was starting over, that would be the main thing I'd change.

"It's not that I didn't wear sun cream. It's more that I didn't always pay attention to just how often I needed to apply it. I'd be more careful about that if I got my chance again. That and wearing sunglasses."

Harrington has even 'spotted a few things' on fellow players and caddies that he has brought to their attention and suggested they get checked.

"That's just the way I am," he said. "If I'm in someone's company and I see something, I'll say, 'You know what, you need to get that checked out.' I'll say it to spectators, too. If I'm signing autographs and I see somebody who's cooking, I'll say to them, 'Hey, you'd better watch.'"

Harrington now wears sun cream pretty much every time he's outside. He keeps spray-on cream by both the front and back doors of his house and also makes sure to carry either a spray-on or roll-on stick – if

not both – in his bag so he has, in his words, 'no excuses' for getting burned.

"For a lot of people, it's a time thing," he said. "You know, 'Do I have time to put on sun cream, go and wash my hands and then go and get ready?' Most times, the answer's 'no'. We don't spend enough time warming up, never mind anything else. But you've got to make time. Catch it early and skin cancer is very treatable. Leave it long enough and, well, it's a cancer and it can spread into your body and kill you."

He also says that attitudes towards skin protection are changing on tour.

"Guys used to joke about Tony Johnstone, saying that an acupuncturist wouldn't be able to get a needle in his neck. His skin was that hard. Coming from Zimbabwe, he was well used to the sun. But the way people spoke about that back then, it was almost a badge of honour. It's not like that anymore. People are a lot more aware of the risks."

As its players have become more aware of the dangers posed by long, sustained exposure to the sun, the game's main organisations have started to put practices and procedures in place to both raise awareness and better monitor the risks of skin cancer.

In 2013, the PGA Tour joined forces with the Skin Cancer Foundation for precisely those purposes, creating a promotional video featuring the likes of Rory McIlroy, Luke Donald and Adam Scott talking about the importance of sun protection on the course. At the time, Perry Robins, the president of the charity, described the association as a 'natural fit'. "Both playing and watching golf entail a lot of time spent in direct sunlight, so it's important that players and enthusiasts incorporate sun protection into their lives on and off the course," he said.

The European Tour, meanwhile, is upping its game with regards to how much it knows about what players are doing to protect themselves against the dangers



of unprotected sun exposure. Dr Roger Hawkes, the chief medical officer for the tour, told bunkered that a review was undertaken in recent times to 'fully understand the issues so that we can get our house in order'.

"Whilst we offer screenings, we don't really have a handle on what other measures players are taking, from going for their own private screenings to wearing sun cream," said Hawkes. "We don't really know quite how seriously they take it. This review will help to establish that. I think we've got to do two things, in particular. One, we've got to make taking preventative measures easier to do and, two, we've got to make them available."

The screenings he refers to are carried out multiple times per year on-site at European Tour events by Screen4Life, a mobile private cancer and health screening clinic.

The screenings are non-compulsory, non-invasive and are carried out using a SIAscope, a hand held scanner that provides colour 'bitmaps' called SIAscans. These scans provide accurate images of the melanin, blood, and collagen below moles or lesions to quickly and accurately evaluate how dangerous they may or may not be.

English golfer Philip Golding decided to make use of the screening service in 2012, not long after he became eligible for the European Senior Tour. It turned out to be a very good decision.

"I never expected any problems but I was immediately given a referral to see my GP," explained Golding. "That, in turn, led to me visiting a dermatologist in London, who confirmed that I had a Basal Cell Carcinoma. I finished that season in Mauritius and went to get the growth cut out over the winter. It was a relief to know that the Senior Tour can provide such an invaluable service to our players, who have been exposed to the sun for 30 to 40 years."

In 2015, he again visited the Screen4Life team, this time at the SSE Enterprise Senior Wales Open, where another BCC was identified.

Dr Hawkes added: "We've got a duty of care as employees of the tour to make sure people are educated and there's a trickle-down benefit of that, too. If our players are educated and doing the right things, then the general public will hopefully get the message, too."
